

ELECTION SIGNS

Know the rules before you put up your sign

Running for Council? Planning to display election signs?

Under the C1.0 Signs Code of the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council Planning Scheme, election signs can be displayed without planning approval when they meet the following requirements:

YOUR SIGN MUST:

- Stay on private land (it must not encroach onto any road or other public land).
- Be no larger than 1.5m²
- Go up no more than 8 weeks before polling closes (not before 1 September 2026).
- Come down within 7-days after polling closes (down by 3 November 2026).

Make sure you have permission from the landowner before putting up a sign on private property.

Important information to note

NO COUNCIL LAND

Election signs must not be placed on land owned or administered by Council. This includes Council roads, reserves and other Council-managed public land.

DON'T GET CAUGHT OUT

Signs that don't meet the above requirements may require planning approval and may be subject to enforcement action.

Non-compliant signs may be removed, with enforcement available under *section 48A of the Land Use Planning and Approvals Act 1993*.
